Slow Flow - Te Ia Kōrero - 2010

21.01.2010 - 31.01.2010

Slowflow 2010 invites artists, technologists and environmentalists on a 10 day journey down the Whanganui River, Aotearoa/New Zealand by double hulled 22 person waka haurua (canoe) and bicycle, creating a setting for a flow of conversations - Te Ia Kōrero.

Slowflow 2010 starts in the foothills of the central North Island volcanoes, passing through temperate rain forest, visiting sites of counter cultural interest and staying each night in Maraes, before arriving at the town and the sea.

Part self-propelled residency, part un-conference, part expedition - Slowflow provides an opportunity for discussing and reflecting on culture, technology and the environment and developing creative projects. Outputs from Slowflow will be collected for an exhibition at the Greenbench and last year's works will be presented at the Greenbench during Feb 2010.

Costs range from \$20 per day for self-provided community days, to \$100 per day for full board with discounts for ten day bookings or small groups.
